Telehandler Training Courses Coquitlam - Employers are responsible for making certain that their supervisory and operating personnel are trained to work competently utilizing telehandler machinery. The competence level of staff must be assessed. If deficiencies are found, employers must provide training so that staff obtain the necessary level of skill. The responsibility level of the person has to be taken into consideration when training is offered. Effective training would remedy whatever deficiencies in the skills, understanding and knowledge of telehandler operators and supervisors. Training could be undertaken through in-house session or by hiring an external training provider. An assessment at the completion of the training period would determine if the learning goals have been met or not.

State/Provincial, local and federal rules set out guidelines for basic telehandler operator testing and training. Basic training does not address such topics as the lifting of persons, the lifting of suspended loads, using various attachments, or the utilization of rotating machines. Further training should be undertaken if such tasks are required on the work location.

Inspection and maintenance

Similar to whatever machinery, a telehandler requires effective maintenance. The equipment inevitably would suffer wear eventually. Proper maintenance is vital to ensuring safe utilization of the telehandler machinery. Inspections and checks are vital to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators need to have machine-specific training to be able to prevent, rectify and monitor problems associated with wear, deterioration and damage. Employees require experience and competence in both periodic and breakdown maintenance. The preventive maintenance instructions of the manufacturer must be viewed seriously and followed, considering such factors as frequency of use and environmental circumstances in the work setting.

The user of the equipment along with the owner of the machinery share the responsibility for making certain that the telehandler is in full working condition. Pre-use checks are usually done by the user, whilst general maintenance is normally carried out by the telehandler owner.
