Forklift License Coquitlam - Within North America, getting forklift certification or a forklift license involves classroom and hands-on training. Regulatory control over training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of provincial, federal and state groups. Operators could acquire a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. Regardless, regulatory requirements have to be met. Recertification is required every two to three years.

Lift trucks are powered industrial trucks which come together with various options, like sit-down and stand-up. There are various sizes and types of forklift suitable for different industrial uses. Operator training courses are usually individualized to deal with the certain kinds and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down lift truck within a warehouse setting will not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered forklift in a shipyard. The various forklifts and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all machines and industries. Regulatory standards, thus, tend not to focus on particular program requirements but instead on the outcome of individual training courses.

Employer-provided, on-the-job training is the most common way for operators to obtain their forklift license or certification. This method of certification requires the employer to provide practical training and classroom sessions on machinery within the workplace. Employers can opt to train personnel on every kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all machines combined. The program incorporates forklift operation procedures, company rules, forklift maintenance and safety measures. Topics particular to the worksite, like dangerous materials or conditions, must be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely use and operate every kind of forklift on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor normally requires an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

Normally, an employer-provided certification will not transfer from the present employer to the next employer. Obtaining a lift truck license through employer-provided training enables the operator to operate a lift truck for that particular employer only.

The most significant aspect of lift truck license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements differ from one kind of equipment to another. Safety problems vary from industry to industry and from employer to employer. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers may have to address extra requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, like in marine and offshore operations.
